Why does our Community need to BUS

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- Gem County
 - Current court cases, at any given time, involving adolescent drug use average 45 (Gem County adolescent population – 2,695).
 - An estimated 20% of adolescents are using illegal substances.
 - As high as 10% of those using illegal substances are using opioids.
 - "Opioids are one of the easiest drugs to access in our county. Social Media Advertising makes it easy for dealers to deliver here." (Chief of Police City of Emmett)


A study by Avner Ziv found that students scored higher in their final assessment when the professors used humor in their lectures.

One on ones - Brain Breaks

<u>Description –</u> Behavioral Specialists meet for 15 minutes with students who have been identified by teachers and staff with the one of the following criteria:

 Kids love undivided attention from a trusted adult that can be a sounding board, cheerleader and teacher.





<u>Recess Buddies – All Elementary</u> <u>Schools</u>

Description – Behavioral Specialists go out to recess with the kids

Goal - To help students who are alone or feel alone join a group and play together.





Mentor Group – High School

Description – 12 upperclassmen students with leadership skills and exemplary behavior were identified to mentor 15 to 20 lowerclassmen at risk students.

Goal - Help at risk students spend time with positive peer role models and engage in activities that are fun, safe, and encourage positive experiences.





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Lunch Friend Groups Description – A small group of students who meet once a week for pizza and an activity. They are recommended for the group by teachers and staff because they meet one of the following criteria:

- They tend to be alone most of the time at school.
- They are new and have not made friends yet.
- They have been bullied by other students and need a positive experience with peers their age.

Anxiety Support Group – Middle School

Description – A small group of students who meet once a week for an activity that teaches skills to help reduce stress and anxiety. They are recommended for the group by teachers and staff because they meet one of the following criteria:

- They have had episodes of abnormal stress and anxiety in academic settings such as testing or projects.
- They are at an increased risk for low self-esteem due to perfectionism.
